Speakers

Ezennia Ed Keazor

Ezennia Ugonabo Ed Emeka Keazor is an historian, lawyer, filmmaker and writer. He has published several books on various subjects of Nigerian history including *The Federation Cup and Nigeria*; *120 Great Nigerians We Never Knew*; *The Lagos Hamburg Line: A Brief History of German Commerce in Nigeria* amongst others. His documentary film works include the critically acclaimed *Onunaekwuluora - the legend of Thurstan Shaw*; *January 15, 1970: Untold Memories of the Nigeria - Biafra War*; *Company Yaya? - Lost African Voices of World War II*. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Nigerian Legal History Society and the board of directors of Iba Ajie (the Ukpabi Asika Knowledge Resource Centre). He was also the recipient of an award from the African Society of Cambridge University in 2014 for his work in African History.



Uzoma Nnganyadi

Uzoma Nnganyadi is a trained Mechanical Engineer with over 42 years of extensive multi-disciplinary engineering and management experience. Dr Emmanuel Ikechukwu Umeonyirioha

Emmanuel Umeonyirioha, is a polyglot, researcher, writer and creative. A freelance Chinese and English language teacher, he is the first Igbo language lecturer at the University of Oxford and recently became a James Currey member at the African Studies Centre of the University of Oxford. His research is focused on African studies, history and development and on reviving the Igbo language worldwide, which UNESCO declared would be dead by 2025. He is a member of the Organization of African Academic Doctors (OAAD) and the Coordinator of Africa-Sino Research Group under the OAAD. Dr Umeonyirioha also promotes an NGO to support youths' development program following the United Nations Development Goals. Dr Umeonyirioha is a Pan-Africanist that strives to seek better pathways towards African development and economic freedom. He is a cross cultural mediator, a Sino-Nigeria and Sino-African relationship expert and an advocate of UN 2030 Sustainable Development Goals and African Union Agenda 2063.
